FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

This evening I looked back at an old text message. It was 12 words – seemed harmless enough. It was from Rick Warren, you know, the guy who wrote the “Purpose Driven Life”. No, he’s not a personal friend. It’s a mass mailing I receive daily. They are supposed to be inspirational. These little messages are supposed to lift me up. Rick sends these messages with the hope that he will be a blessing to someone. But this one cut deep. This one was different. Are you ready to hear it?

Before I share it, though, let me ask you a question. Do you love Jesus? I mean do you really, really love him? Have you given your life to the One who died for you? I hope so. I pray that you do. I pray for you often.

So, you’re ready now, right? Just 12 words. One more thing. Do you love your neighbor? I’m not talking about whether you wave as you pass each other in the driveway. Do you actively love your neighbor? Oh, and by the way, who is your neighbor? Go read Luke chapter 10. That’s okay, I’ll wait.

Oh yeah, those 12 words, I almost forgot. Ready? Here they are... “You love Jesus as much as the person you love the least.”

I guess at some level I already knew this, it wasn’t new information. But God used these 12 words in a text message to speak to me. If you read it too fast you won’t get it. “*You love Jesus as much as the person you love the least.*”

It’s easy to make a list of the people you love, isn’t it? It’s easy to list all of the good things you’ve done for people. I can name names and give plenty of examples of people I have loved – even when it was hard. But, what about the people I haven’t loved the way Jesus loves us?

These 12 words have messed with me. I hope they mess with you today. Why? Because I love you enough to ask you, how much do you love Jesus?

“*You love Jesus as much as the person you love the least.*”

This summer I tried to read through the entire bible in 90 days. I did well for the first month, getting behind a little bit, but I caught up, months two and three were not so great. The lack of a “normal schedule” (I use that phrase very loosely) did not help; I traveled and was busy most of this summer with conference, camp, Vacation Bible School, writing for ordination, and a week of vacation. This is not an excuse to not keep up with my reading, it just became my reality, but I have not given up, I am going to keep on reading until I finish, hopefully before the end of the year.

Reading scripture in such large sections (10-15 chapters a day) gave me some new insights to stories I thought I knew well. When we only read a few verses or paragraphs at a time and skip around according to what our daily devotional is focused on that day, it is easy to miss some interesting details of scripture. That is why I am excited about the bible study options we have coming up this fall. While some of these studies may have already started by the time you read this, it is never too late to begin studying God’s word on a deeper level. The more I read God’s word, the more I want to read it. While scripture never changes, it does change us as we read it. If you have not experienced that kind of change, I encourage you to check with those teaching our various bible studies, it may not be too late to join.

Reading the bible by yourself can be hard, it was written in a very different time and culture than what we are in today; that is why we gather together to study the scriptures. While alone we may not be able to understand a certain text, together we can help one another. Those who are new to reading scripture can learn from those who have studied the bible for many years. Those who have studied scripture for many years can gain new insights from those who are new to reading the bible.

While all of us are not always able to be a part of a bible study group, I hope that we all are taking to the time to dig into God’s word for ourselves and trying to learn as much as we can. If you every have a question about something you have read in scripture, or if you want to know what scripture says about a certain topic, Pastor Rich and I are more than happy to sit down and help you find the answers that you are looking for, and if we do not know then together we can search the scriptures and learn as a team.

Getting to Know...



A new series of articles from the desk of the Director of Child Care Ministries, helping our Church Family know our programs better and understand our purpose.

Have you ever found yourself thinking about what goes on in a day care? Likely not, we know. You're busy. At Care with Grace, though, we often find that people look upon our staff as mere babysitters, supervising children as they play freely and without structure for twelve hours each day. Perhaps that is the case in some day care centers, but certainly not at Grace!

We are proud to offer a structured day and academic environment to children each and every day. Our day care children participate in a morning meeting, calendar time, read-alouds, math lessons, science experiences, music lessons, gross motor activities, fine motor practice, and more. Our after school children do enjoy some free time after school, but also experience daily lessons and activities filled with new ideas, skills, and information.

Each of our classrooms delivers enrichment and learning to children in a different way. Our Preschool Age Room is staffed by a team of capable women with a heart for early learning. Lisa Grosch has spent nearly two and a half decades working with children. Brittany Wakley earned her Bachelor's Degree studying early childhood and

special education. Each day, these ladies plan and facilitate exciting and engaging activities for our three and four year olds, assisted by their Aide, Tiffany Weyant, who has worked in multiple child care facilities and churches. They have recently introduced their Jungle Theme for the new school year and their room is filled with fun trees and vines. Along with formal teaching, this team also spends a great deal of time providing emotional and behavioral support. Being away from mom and dad for so many hours at such a young age can be tough. Children often feel this, but aren't yet capable of expressing it properly. Our amazing staff is skilled in recognizing these issues and dealing with them compassionately.

Our Older Toddler Room is led by Laura Leichtenberger. Laura has been with us for nearly four years and holds a Bachelor's Degree in Elementary Education. Laura spends her days leading our youngest children in incredibly enlightening activities. Through science, art, cooking, music, and play, our two year olds quickly improve their verbal abilities, recognize colors and shapes, rote count, recite the alphabet, begin recognizing and naming the letters in their name, and completing calendar activities, all in the midst of the challenge of potty training. Not only does Laura have a talent for creating unique experiences, she is also able to single handedly teach and manage our little ones all day. She, too, provides immense emotional and behavioral support. Laura has just prepared her room for fall, creating an inviting space filled with bulletin board decorations, leaves, and the smell of homemade applesauce.

GAP, our after school program, runs for only two and half hours each day. We manage to pack a lot in, though. This school year, we have embarked on a theme called 'Around the World.' We spend our afternoons reading stories, listening to music, viewing movie clips, tasting new foods, doing crafts, and learning about various cultures and countries. Homework time is also available to anyone who needs it. Our after school children arrive at our facility tired and worn after a long day at school. Often, they stay at GAP for an hour or two only to be whisked away by mom or dad to soccer practice or gymnastics. Today's kids are busy! This, too, takes an emotional toll. Managing the behaviors, broad age range, and emotional dynamics of our after school program is a challenging, yet satisfying task that I, personally, enjoy facing each day.

Often in child care, there is a high turnover of employees. The truth is, simply, that it takes a very special person to be a teacher, surrogate parent, nurse, dietitian, behavioral specialist, speech pathologist, janitor, hygienist, and personal teddy bear to nearly twenty children each day. We are blessed to have these amazing individuals at Grace.

Our staff is so much more than idle babysitters. Please be sure to visit our web pages at www.carewithgracedaycare.com and www.graceafterschoolprogram.com to learn more about them and the work they do each day. Church members are also always welcome to come for a visit. Our rooms are open for viewing on Sundays, but you are also welcome to stop and visit us during the week. Our teachers would love to meet you and thank you for your ongoing support.
